Activity 1: What money is and what it can do

Dear Parents,

Welcome to the first activity in Workbook One! Throughout the three workbooks in this series, you will need to help your children explore money with each activity and game. These Parent's Pages will give you an overview of what each activity is about, what you need to help your child learn while completing the activity, and what resources might be useful when doing the activity. Until your child is able to competently read, you will need to help them with each activity sheet, so that they know what to do.

This activity is designed to formally introduce your child to the concept of money, something they definitely have seen around and being used by you. Now is definitely the time for them to learn that most things cost money and that you need to pay for them before you can have them. This is an important lesson to learn in time for big school (kindergarten), as some of their peers may have things from the canteen, and they will need to understand that they need to have money to be able to get those things as well.

If you have not already introduced your child to money, this is an excellent way to do so. If your child is already familiar with money, then they should be able to easily identify the money in the activity questions that follow. ☺
